George L. Farley was the State 4-H Leader in Massachusetts from 1916 to 1941 and is considered by many to have contributed more to the 4-H program in Massachusetts than any other person. Mr. Farley was born in Lynn, Massachusetts in 1873 and was educated there prior to attending Dartmouth College. He began his career as a teacher and later became the Superintendent of Schools in Brockton. While Superintendent he created a home and school garden project, enrolling about 2500 students. This project garnered the attention of the Massachusetts Agricultural College and he was asked to take the position as State 4-H Leader, following the first 4-H State Leader, O. A. Morton.

During his 25 years as State Leader, 4-H camps in Massachusetts grew; the 4-H Camp on Cape Cod was named after him. Mr. Farley is credited with starting the Massachusetts All-Stars, a 4-H Alumni Association. After seeing a 4-H candle lighting service in Virginia, he brought this back to Massachusetts to use at 4-H camps and other events and activities.

Mr. Farley's greatest legacy may be the impact that he had on young people. He inspired young people across the state to believe in themselves, do their best and to strive for something better. He was known to say, "My work is with young people. They are the hope of the future."

The amount of the scholarship presented in recognition of George Farley varies from year to year but is generally from \$500 to \$1,000. This scholarship is presented every year.

CRITERIA FOR ELIGIBILITY FOR SCHOLARSHIP:

- 🍀 Must be an accepted student or currently enrolled at UMass Amherst or the Stockbridge School with a current UMass ID number.
- Must have been a 4-H member in Massachusetts.

- Preference will be given to applicants:
 - Intending to pursue a career in agriculture or a related field.
 - Members who were actively involved in 4-H and display a continuing involvement in 4-H.
 - Enrolled in the College of Natural Sciences or the Stockbridge School of Agriculture.
 - An individual can reapply for the scholarship; however, preference will be given to first time applicants.
