Planning to continue in 4-H? The time to re-enroll is just around the corner! All youth and adult volunteers are required to re-enroll each year if they plan to continue participating in 4-H.

Re-enrollment will open for all clubs whose financial reports have been accepted by regional offices. Club leaders who have outstanding reports, please submit them ASAP.

The Massachusetts 4-H year runs from October 15th through October 14th of the following year. Returning members and volunteers may begin re-enrolling in 4honline beginning October 15th or they may complete a paper enrollment packet (available at regional offices).

Re-enrollment FAQs

When Do I Enroll?

After 10/15/23, 4-H members and volunteers can log into 4honline and re-enroll.

Why Do I Need to Enroll?

Both 4-H youth members **and** volunteers need to re-enroll each year to be covered by 4-H accident insurance and to participate in any 4-H program. Click <u>here</u> for more information on how to navigate re-enrollment in 4honline.

- * Members: To be fully enrolled to participate in club meetings and events you must be re-enrolled and have paid your membership fee or have an approved waiver. If you need paper copies of the enrollment or fee waiver forms, your regional office can email or mail them to you.
- * Volunteers: There is no fee for volunteers to re-enroll, but you must update your contact information and agree to the current 4-H policies via the re-enrollment process.

What if I Have Never Re-enrolled Online or Forgot How to Do It?

- # If you are a current 4-H member, you already have an account/profile. This was set up by your local office when you enrolled for the first time with your paper enrollment forms.
- # If you have not logged in and set your password, now is the time to work with your office to make sure you are all set to log in.

Forgot your email associated with the account? We can look up the email used to register. Do not set up a new account. Contact us.

Forgot your password? You can request one or the office can trigger action for a new password and send you a temporary one. Contact us.

Where Do I Pay?

Even though 4honline has an embedded payment portal, as a UMass Amherst program, we use the University payment portal, instead of the 4honline payment feature. Therefore, when enrolling in 4honline, you *MUST* select Non-electronic/check payment, even if you plan to pay electronically with a credit card.

- If paying by check, mail to your regional office and they will enter your payment information into the system.
- If paying by credit card, use the <u>UMass link</u> and offices will get notified when your payment gets processed.

How will I know I am done with the enrollment process?

Once both enrollment information and payment are processed, the office will approve your membership and send you confirmation that your enrollment is complete.

Am I Allowed to Enroll in More than One Project?

4-H juniors and seniors may enroll in up to four different projects in up to two counties. They will need to declare a primary club and will compete as a member of that club's county in all contests and events. They may only participate in a particular project club once (example: can only belong to one goat club). Cloverbuds only enroll in the Cloverbud project.

Why Can I No Longer See All Project Areas for Cloverbuds?

We have learned there exists some confusion about the <u>Cloverbud policy</u>. Cloverbuds can only register in the Cloverbud project regardless of their areas of interest. For 2023-2024, project selections in 4honline are restricted based on the age of the youth, meaning that Cloverbuds can only register in the Cloverbud project.

What if We are a Current 4-H Family and Want to Enroll a New Member?

If you have new members in your family, you will need to complete a paper packet for them. Contact your regional office for a paper enrollment packet.

What if I Want to Enroll for the First Time as a Volunteer?

Those interested in becoming new volunteers can reach out to their regional office for an application packet and to register for an onboarding orientation Zoom session.

Why Should I Stay Subscribed to Receive Emails?

Please stay subscribed. If you select "Unsubscribe" from email, you will not get NewsBlasts, reminders of events, or relevant project/program specific information except in the case of critical information when that needs to go out to all families. The biweekly NewsBlast is the main source of consistent information regarding upcoming programs and registration information/deadlines. We also use the database to provide information to select groups for opportunities based on age and project specific events.

Thanks to all the clubs who have been participating in the Seasons for Giving Community Service Program!

A link has been sent out to club leaders for the 4th Season of Giving, as we are getting to the end of our 4-H year. It is great to see that some clubs have completed community service throughout the year and have submitted in each season so far. Clubs completing their 4th season of participation can pick from curriculum for the upcoming 4-H year or an end-of-year pizza or ice cream party to celebrate!

The program is designed for you to submit your projects as you complete them or you may submit them quarterly; however, if you have community service projects from earlier in the year, you can still enter them. This means that even if you completed a community service project back at the beginning of the 4-H year, you could still submit it.

Remember that this program is progressive, and the reward choices get bigger and bigger the more you do throughout the year!

Notes about completing the form:

- The survey is for multiple types of projects and many of you will only have participated in one type of community service. Enter "0" or "null" in any sections that do not apply to you.
- You will receive a copy of your responses that you can save to include in your year-end club report.

What is the Four Seasons of Giving Program?

Service to others has always been an important part of the 4-H club program. One part of the 4-H pledge states, "I pledge my hands to larger service." An entire section of the 4-H Summary Record is dedicated to the documentation of community service done by each 4-H member.

4-H groups often conduct community service projects in local communities where they meet. These projects include community beautification, collecting donations for food pantries, raising money for charities, volunteering in nursing homes and donating needed items to hospice and hospitals, to name just a few.
