- Participate in conference calls
- Commit to helping at two events in the coming year with Massachusetts 4-H:
 - Lead or co-teach a workshop at Winter Forum
 - Lead or-co-teach an activity at Explore UMass Program at UMass
 - Plan activity and work at MA 4-H Animal Academies
 - Conduct an activity at a Massachusetts fair or agricultural event
 - Conduct an activity at an ag business such as Tractor Supply

Application (must include):

- Answer the following questions:
 - 1. Describe your experience in communications and leadership.
 - 2. Describe your outreach efforts in promoting 4-H within the Commonwealth *Highlight if around one of the tracks of AgriScience, STEM or Healthy Living.
 - 3. After visiting the Program Schedule what opportunities do you see for incorporating some of the trainings into the Massachusetts 4-H program?
- Include one Letter of Recommendation
