

## 4-H Volunteer Application for Funds to Support Workshops/Conferences/Training Sessions

The Massachusetts 4-H Youth Development Program supports the training and development of volunteers. While volunteers are encouraged to attend training sessions that 4-H offers, the 4-H program can't provide all of the training needed by 4-H volunteers. Volunteers are encouraged to participate in conferences and workshops offered by other organizations that will give them the information and skills needed to improve and develop in their 4-H volunteer roles.

To support volunteers in this endeavor, funds are available to assist them in covering the cost of workshops and conferences. The funds are provided by the Massachusetts 4-H Foundation. Partial funding is provided if your application is approved; this is usually one-half of the fee up to a maximum of \$100. Proof of payment is required prior to reimbursement. You may submit this form along with a program flyer to seek approval prior to committing your own funds and submit proof of payment at a later date. Partial funding is sometimes available from local 4-H Advisory Councils.
