#### Site Trial Costs and Returns

Develop a framework and measure whole-farm changes in costs and returns under different agrivoltaic designs, compared to no panels.

- Products: Cranberries, Hay, Cattle, Butternut Squash, Lettuce\*
- Framework: Total Revenues from Ag and Energy production minus
  Total Costs from Ag and Energy production
- Goal 1: Evaluate effect of site trial installations on farm net costs and revenues
- Goal 2: Develop Enterprise Budget Modules that flow into NREL's InSPIRE "Dual-Use Financial Model"
