
A model for student engagement in agricultural science and policy that incorporates experiential learning intern-/externships with

Agriculture and Food Systems Fellows Program

What is the RI Agriculture and Food Systems Fellows Program (AFSFP)?

- A PAID full year (Jan-Dec) internship for CCRI and URI students of all majors interested in food system-related careers. Students will also receive course credit.
- Students are selected for placements with nonprofits, organizations, farms, government agencies or university faculty to work on foodsystem related projects.
- Fellows will receive in-depth professional development and industry training as well as extensive networking opportunities.

ITR 301 & ITR 303- Professional Development Seminar

The Internship Seminar allows students to come together as a learning community to share internship experiences with their peers and instructor and reflect upon their meaning within a safe forum. The academic assignments are specifically designed with the intent to enrich the learning experience throughout the internship. Some additional goals students will complete in seminar are:

- Articulate and apply principles learned in and outside the classroom
- Complete assignments that encourage in-depth reflection of the internship experience
- Gain self-understanding, self-confidence, and interpersonal skills
- Develop work competencies and skills for a specific profession or occupation

The training series is intended to provide the fellows with an overview of our local food system, including infrastructure, markets and policy initiatives in the region via site visits, tours, service-learning opportunities and lectures.
