III. MAP SITES

Accurate mapping is fundamental to many of the subsequent steps of the development and implementation of IPM. Permanent structures often play a role in turf health and pest activity. Some properties already have access to some form of map or blue print, but may not include certain key items. While a comprehensive map is ideal, mapping of available information is important. The goal should be to map problem areas and physical structures that could impact management decisions.

A. PERMANENT FEATURES

Permanent features of each property, field area or facility within the IPM program are mapped and changes are made as they occur. Include items that may affect use, turf stress or pest problems. Include how the turf use and maintenance may affect surroundings. The following are some important structures and items to be included:
