



State 4–H Community Service Project 2019–2020 Four Seasons of Giving

4–H clubs and groups will have an opportunity to collect items to benefit the greater community through the Four Seasons of Giving. Suggested community service outreach projects are listed in the chart below for each season. Clubs can choose to participate in one, two, three or all four seasons. Those participating in all 4 seasons receive larger incentive awards. Clubs will report on Survey Monkey to register their participation and be eligible for incentives.

Of course, clubs can still choose to conduct their own traditional community service project.

Suggested Projects: (4–H clubs/groups may choose one of these or create their own project)

Reporting:

- *Clubs must report results on Survey Monkey during each “season” to be eligible for the incentive.* The link will be sent by your county educator.
- Each season, the survey will be open for a three-week window during which reports can be made. The survey will close after that window. Once the survey closes it will be too late to report for that season and too late to get the incentive. Your educator will alert you to the reporting window.
- Clubs can choose to participate one time or multiple times (incentives provided one time per season)
- Clubs will be eligible for incentives each season they participate.

Incentives:

To encourage clubs to participate the following incentives will be awarded:

<p>First time Participating and reporting</p>	<p>Choice of either a Large Meeting Folder, or 2 packages of 4-H Thank You cards for club, or 4-H clover stamp and ink pad.</p> 
<p>Second time participating and reporting</p>	<p>Choice of either 4-H Record Book covers (one per member) or Outdoor 4-H Flag (2'x3') for club.</p> 
<p>Third time participating and reporting</p>	<p>Choice of 4-H Grows Here banner, or 4-H Club gavel, or Green and White Canvas Tote</p> 
<p>Fourth time participating and reporting</p>	<p>Choice of 4-H Curriculum (up to \$80) or six 4-H Cinch Bags</p>
