Requirements of 4-H Horse Team Coaches and Assistant Coaches

All team coaches must have a current CORI form on file with the 4-H office. Coaches must be at least 25 years of age. Assistant Coaches must be 21 years of age. Coaches must assist with their state level contest. In addition, coaches must attend the New England 4-H Horse Roundup as well as the National 4-H Horse Roundup. Coaches must schedule and hold at least 10 team meetings (minimum of 20 hours) prior to the National Roundup. Additional meetings or team assignments are encouraged as necessary. Coaches need to be able to offer flexible times for practices and locations that are convenient to team members and parents. Coaches may also be asked to present their contest information at county or state events.
